We've had one of our busiest months on record, and I would like to than all who helped out at the different activities.

FRIENDS OF FRENCH ISLAND VISIT - OCTOBER 22nd

A most warm and pleasant day greeted our visitors from the French Is. Friends group. Ken Harris ably led the group of about 6 visitors, with a good representation from our Friends, around the Stringybark walk. We were all delighted with the large number of orchids flowering, as well as the high species count for the day - at least a dozen species! Following a terrific lunch {rather late) we took a stroll through our new Billy's Creek area. Some of us actually ventured past the far fence into the more bushy upstream areas. Worth a visit, but watch out for the nettles! To top off the day, at afternoon tea Ken observed a Brush Cuckoo in the Foster's Gully area, which will now be added to the Bird List for the Park.

JUNIOR RANGER DAY - NOVEMBER 6th

About 30 children with 10 adults joined us for our first-ever Junior Ranger Day. It was a good group to begin with, with children from many parts of the Valley coming in response to our letters to the Primary Schools. At the end of lunch we presented Rohan Jones and Trina Harris with their cheques for winning the Logo Competition —a proud moment. Robin did a terrific job with leading games for the children which taught them something about conservation and the role of the Ranger. Thank-you! Yvonne helped out with organising Damper and Billy Tea which proved most popular. Thanks to her and also the other Friends who attended, too.

NOVEMBER PROJECT DAY - NOVEMBER 13th

A group of 10 helped out on this important day in surveying Koalas and Orchids. Being an extremely hot day we were in for a few surprises! We surprised many with our Koala results: 8 very lethargic koalas, several of which were quite low in the trees and 2 were even discovered in Pittosporum trees! Altogether, 5 were found in Foster's Gully, 2 in Stringybark and 1 along the East Boundary. Ken reported a 50% increase in the number of Orchid flowers from the four Study Sites, despite no real increase in the number of plants. About 5% of the plants had open flowers, but it is expected that they will all open in the next few weeks.

At the Committee meeting preceding the Project afternoon, it was decided to move our programme onto the THIRD SUNDAY OF THE MONTH starting in 1989. The main reason for this is to avoid quite a few public holidays {eg. Labor Day, Mothers Day) and school holidays. If you have any real concerns about this please contact Yvonne or myself ASAP.
