Our November meeting was a perfect koala-spotting day. A small group turned out to cover the Fosters Gully and Stringybark Ridge walks. Three koalas were spotted by each group. Although no young were spotted, those that could be examined appeared to be very heal thy. Considering the size of each group, the results were very positive.

Wanna hear same good news? Rob revealed recently that \$30,000 has been allocated to , improving the Billy's Creek area. This will include weed removal and tree planting. The bio-degradable guards that we used this year have only been moderately successful, through stunting growth of the seedlings, and allowing grazing animals access with a minimum of fuss. Next year we will use wire guards, which will have the benefit of being re-usable once the seedlings are established. The problem for the moment, however, will be construction and moving of the bulky beasts. This will mean, more than ever, that as many hands as possible will be needed on our planting days. I know its a bit rough putting the wind up you this early on, but there is no harm in being forewarned.
