Those who went along to **Rotomah Island** (Gippsland Lakes) with the Group a couple of years ago will have pleasant memories of a very peaceful weekend staying at the Lodge. We have been able to secure a booking again this year, the 3rd/4th April. Cost is \$25 per person for the weekend, Saturday-Sunday. Accommodation is comfortable bunks (with proper mattresses), and the rooms cater for varying numbers, from memory 3 to about 8 (sorry, no "Honeymoon suite"!) There is a large kitchen/dining room and the Group will be self-catering (thus the reasonable tariff) so you will be expected to bring along casseroles, cakes and the like. A car pool will be organised to go via Loch Sport to Sperm Whale Head (where the cars must be left) and the wardens will take us by boat across the very short distance to the island jetty. From there it is a short walk to the lodge. The area is run by the Ornithological Trust and is a bird and wildlife sanctuary.
