G'day everyone, all the best of the season to you and welcome to the latest edition of our newsletter. I hope you have all survived the silly season OK, enjoyed all the good bits (family, friends, food and festivities) and avoided the not-so-good bits (fires, flies, hot weather, over-indulgence). We are still praying for rain, having been placed on Stage 4 water restrictions on 20/12/06, so we can no longer water our gardens from the town system. We received 36.5mm in December, making it 711mm for the year, about 8 inches under our average. All those nice wet thunderstorms recently, seemed to make a point of going around us to the north, so we got hardly any rain from them. Catching our grey water in buckets isn't a long term solution, but for the short term at least some plants will get a drink.

#### **January Activity**

On the calendar for Sunday, January 21 is a return to a more traditional summer activity, although it is really just a continuation of our weeding program. We've called it The Annual Weir Walk, but it entails jumping into Billy Creek again, probably not starting at the weir, to continue our war against Tutsan and any other feral plant we come across. We will meet at the Junction Road entrance to the Billy Creek section of the Park at 10am. As always you will need clothing and footwear suitable for warding off the pricklies and bities and the conditions on the day and your own lunch and refreshments.

### Weed Wars, Episode XIII December Activity Report

Appearing at Junction Road at the nominated date and time, we were greeted by Rob and Reg. Wendy and Ken weren't too far away. After the obligatory chat, mainly about the 2007 calendar and the alpine fire situation, it was obvious we were it for the day, so into the vehicles and up the track we went. Reg, Cathy and I belted on ahead, parked ourselves on Potato Flat and began donning our gear in preparation for jumping in the creek, when Rob drove straight past and kept going. Rob had all the weed killing paraphernalia, so we had no choice but to walk up the track after him, all the way to the weir. Unbeknownst to us, they had gone to tackle a patch of Foxgloves. We grabbed what we needed and left them to it. Into the creek where we finished up back in September, we were soon into our normal rhythm of cutting and poisoning the odd Tutsan and ripping out any offending thistles, teasel or foxgloves within reach. We made pretty good progress, but it was still after 1pm before we met Rob, Ken and Wendy working upstream from the first ford. Keen for a feed, we called a halt to the war and made our way back to the gate, where Dorothy was waiting for us. Over at Kerry Road, the place was deserted, so we wasted no time in firing up the BBQ, getting stuck into the munchies and partaking of a good red. The flies were ferocious, particularly once the meat went on, but apart from that it was a most pleasant finale to our activity and another year of work in the Park.

Due to the lack of rain and the probability of another poor planting season, we have decided not to grow trees for planting in June and July. These months are now open for suggestions of suitable activities.
