Hello everyone and welcome to this month's newsletter and welcome to 2011. A big merry Christmas and wishes for a happy and safe new year to you all.

The weather continues to be wetter and colder than normal, so it is still very green in the park. The risks of bushfires at this part of the season are now very low but it hard to say what it will be like at the end of summer.

At the end of the December activity and after the barbeque we had a quick committee meeting to discuss the use of monies allocated to us. The meeting occurred in the shed so that we could hide from the storm that had blown up.

For the small hand tools equipment grant that we had received, we decided to put the money towards a star picket remover, sharpening stone, secateurs, wire cutters, lopper and possibly a whipper snipper.

For our 25th anniversary celebration we can write a special application and that could go towards the celebration and either a shelter for Kerry Road picnic area or a fish ladder for Billys' Weir.

Other items discussed are the need to work on making the new brochure for the park and need to write a new application for funding to upgrade the toilets at Kerry Road.

November Activity Report

For this month's activity we had Ken, Beryl, Cathy, Mike, Peter, Wendy, John, Reg, Bronwyn and Darren in attendance. It was good to see John back with us fit and well.

John reported that the echidna written about recently in the Latrobe Valley Express that was travelling through the center of Churchill ended up near their house. John and Margaret then collected the echidna and have relocated it into the National Park (a lot safer home for it). Others discussed how koalas have been spotted near the traffic lights in Churchill and Ken reported how both echidnas and koalas have been located in Mathison Park.

For the nesting box survey Bronwyn had located a camera on an extendable pole with a viewing screen. This was great for looking into the nesting boxes with larger holes and took away the need to open half of the nesting boxes. This was a lot less disruptive to any animals that might have been in the nesting boxes. A great tool we hopefully are able to use in the future since this along with the GPS that made the activity very productive.


During this activity 26 of the nesting boxes were checked, out of the 40 boxes. Next month we will look into the remaining boxes. The count from the survey was at least 3 antechinus (2 in one box and one in another) at least 6 sugar gliders (5 +1) and a nest with two eggs.

At the end of the activity we were greeted by Rob clearing some of the grass near the car park.

Ken also spotted a Spotted Skipper (or Spotted Sedge-skipper) - Hesperilla ornate. It is the first sighting in the Park of this butterfly. Ken's picture is below.



During lunch we were visited by a Grey Shrike-thrush. Ken's photo follows.



After the nesting box survey we had the Christmas Barbeque and a good time was had. The crew who had earlier completed the nesting box survey was joined by Rob, Faye, Margaret and her family. 
<u>January Activity</u> 10.00am Sunday 16th January
