As part of this activity we will update the Kerry Road noticeboard with new photos and the Kookaburra Awards nominations and Ken individual Kookaburra award from 2009.




January Activity

Track potential for major tourist

THE Grand Strzelecki Track in Balook could potentially be a major tourist attraction to the region once it is officially completed by January 2012.

Speaking at the official start of construction of the track last Friday, Regional and Rural Development Minister Peter Ryan said it was a "magnificent venture" which would span 85 kilometres when fully completed.

"It will be a realisation of years of aspirations of the local people," Mr Ryan said.

"The track will have the capacity to attract people, and give them access to the most beautiful parks in Victoria.

"It is a great idea and I am thrilled for the local people."

The track, which will run from the Tarra Bulga Park in the east to the Morwell National Park in the west, has been touted as a tourist drawcard to the area.

Project manager Alan Lewis said the track had the potential to draw tourist dollars of up to \$12 million annually.

"It is estimated that 250,000 people regularly go for walks or hikes in Victoria a year; with a five-day trek such as this, there is the

potential for new business opportunities such as bed and breakfasts, guided tours and other facilities," Mr Lewis said.

"We hope it can become iconic."

Mr Lewis said the idea for the project had been mooted in July 2009 but had suffered significant delays, due to permit applications and agreements.

He said the project was funded through a \$500,000 grant from the Latrobe and Wellington shires. PO Box 19 Churchill 3842
