December Activity Report Sunday 16th December

Nesting Box Survey

At this month's activity we had Mike, Cathy, Ken, Beryl, Brenda, Janna, Peter, Melissa, Wendy, John, Margaret Darren, Tina and Craig along. This was the largest crew we had had for a quite a while. Tina is a new summer crew ranger and also new to the area. She will be around for a few months, so hopefully we will see her again next month.

The worry for the day was the weather and the possibility of rain. The only rain we had over the day was a little drizzle, so we all did not suffer too much. It is very unusual to have an activity in December affected by rain. It is more usual to have it affected by heat.

The group started from the car park with the ladder and the pole mounted camera. We surveyed about 30-35 boxes and were lucky enough to get our best animal count yet. The boxes are increasingly being used by many small mammals. Over the day we spotted at least 29 Sugar Gliders, 2 Agile Antechinus and 2 Ringtail Possums. We say at least this number of animals since in some boxes there could have been more animals hiding behind or under others and in some boxes the animals were active, so we didn't want to disrupt them any further.

This count is higher than we counted last year for the whole count and we still have half of the boxes yet to check. We have yet to find birds or bats in any of the boxes.

For a number of boxes the lids have come off or they are in need of repair and a few will need to be put back onto their trees. These boxes were recorded and they will need to be dealt with next activity.

After the nesting box survey the weather was still good so the group moved to Kerry Road for our Christmas BBQ. It was good to have the whole group together and celebrate the good year the group has had. Our only apology was Fay, who we hope is up and about in full health soon.


