John's Jottings

This snippet on the activities of the Friends of Morwell National Park was sourced and edited from early Newsletter files.

15th September, 1988

Dear Friends,

After the depression of a year ago, it was a joyous occasion to celebrate the arrival of another cub, as we conducted our Annual Koala survey last Sunday. This was most noteworthy as there have only been two previous sightings - September & October 1986.

Congratulations to the proud "parents"!!

Due to only a small gathering of 10 people, we conducted our survey in 3 areas: Fosters Gully, North & East Boundary, and Stringybark. A total of 15 Koalas were found, plus the cub."

"From the statistics gained it would appear the number of Koalas is reasonably constant, and that September is the best survey time. However, the reasonably short time over which we have covered the Park does not lend itself to any significant results yet. One could in fact argue that the numbers appear to be dropping. This may not be true as we have not covered all the areas we have traditionally covered in the past.

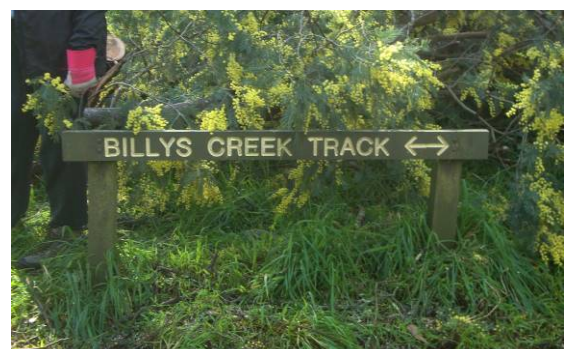
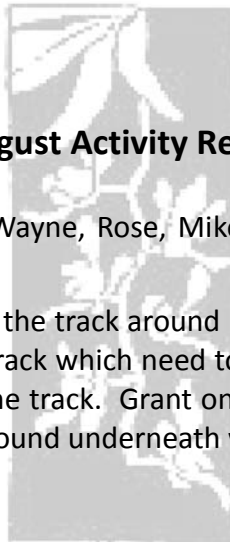
We would encourage all members to help at our next survey in order to make for a clearer picture of our Koala population."



August Activity Report

At this activity we had Beryl, Ken, Grant, Wayne, Rose, Mike, John, Tamara and Darren. Matt was also there for the meeting before the activity.

The purpose of today's activity was to clear the track around Potato Flat. Before reaching Potato Flat there were a few trees down across Billy's Weir Track which need to be dealt with first. The first was top section of a Silver Wattle which had fallen across the track. Grant on the chainsaw did an excellent job of clearing the many broken branches. The track sign found underneath was fortunately unmarked.



The next tree across the track was near the first creek crossing. The group dealt with this before moving onto Potato Flat. The second creek crossing (approaching Potato Flat) is getting difficult to safely traverse via vehicle. A hole has developed making the crossing difficult. More stone or some concrete fence posts at the crossing will make it easier to cross.

Around Potato Flat two more trees were cleared using the chainsaw and the track was slashed clearing the stinging nettles and other weeds from the track. Now there is a full vehicle loop around Potato Flat.

A group walked to Billy's Weir to find that no other trees were down between Potato Flat and Billy's Weir. It was observed that there was more water in creek (finally – so far it has been dry this winter) making tutsan removal from the creek not viable. There was enough water in the creek so that the water at the Weir was flowing over the overflow.



We all had an early lunch at Potato Flat while Rose walked back to the car park.

After lunch went travelled to Kerry Road to clear some trees down across Stringybark Track. One vehicle travelled in with the chainsaws while the rest of group walked in. We used one vehicle to cut down upon damage to the side track, but the vehicle was needed since it was too far to carry the chainsaws and safety gear.

The walkers broke into groups but could not, on a few attempts, find the others in the vehicle with the chainsaw. Later we heard the chainsaw, but could not assist so the walkers returned to the picnic area. It was great to see many walkers out in both parts of the Park.

August Activity

Sunday 17th September 10.00am

The group will meet in the Junction Road car park to complete a walk along the Grand Strzelecki track to the park boundary. We will complete any track maintenance required while travelling along the track. This track has many creek crossings so gumboots or waders would be useful for the numerous creek crossings. You will need to bring your lunch along with clothing suitable for the weather conditions on the day.

Friends of Morwell National Park **2017 Presidents Report**

It's been a very busy time for me personally of late and the need to write this report has become a sudden realisation. That, coupled with me feeling, and another group member hinting, that last years' report may have been a tad long, will see a much shorter version this year.

I would like to start by thanking you all for the work you have done this past year. We've ventured out in all conditions and kept doing the job we love. But while I don't want to dwell on it too much, it's been getting harder to do what we do due to the lack of support from Parks. Two years ago we were still getting a Ranger along to each activity, now we've not only lost that but more and more is being expected of us.

Actually, I will go on about it a bit more. I've felt it's affected the morale of the group to a degree. A couple of people have told me they feel the same. Some days it feels like we have no direction. While we've always made the calendar ourselves (I think?), Rangers provided a guiding hand and a sense of authority. At some activities we've had track maintenance planned, for example, only for us trying to think of work that needs to be done. We've also had more paperwork pushed our way and now with the recent launch of Park Connect, despite it possible advantages, the responsibility of Parks is to tick a box to OK our planned work.

We're constantly told that we are valuable to Parks Victoria and they couldn't operate without us but we are giving our free time (and sometimes more) and are now expected to dedicate even more of our time because the budget doesn't allow for anyone at Parks to do what they used to do.

I guess the key word above is 'budget' because while I sound harsh on Parks, there is an issue there with funding. Still, a lot of the money they do have, in my opinion, is being poorly directed.

OK, enough of my rant, on to what we have done. When you think back we did achieve a lot. We've kept up our surveys such as the nest box inspections, orchid walk and Koala count, Butterfly Orchid survey and of course our mothing night and spotlight walk. But on top of this we've cleared a lot of large obstacles from tracks, opened up both ends of Blue Gum Hill and kept the creek largely clear of Tutsan and other weeds, especially from the weir downwards.

We also now have a decent selection of tools, allowing us to do our work unassisted, both the fun stuff such as the nest boxes and the more typical maintenance work. Sadly I found out that, despite what many of us thought, our private vehicles are not covered for damage incurred doing what we do so that may become a future issue. Also on another personal note, the motion sensing cameras have not been out much the past 12 months due to time constraints but I do hope to resume them once the days lengthen. We did get them out a few times and we also had the Traralgon High Schools kids place some in the Park.

Friends of Morwell National Park now also has a Facebook page. It will be interesting to see if it gains us any new members or awareness but I suppose it can't hurt to have it? We must be gaining some kind of fame as we even managed to get a politician along to the July nest box survey. Melina Bath introduced herself at the Junction Rd car park and joined in with the first handful of box inspections. Sadly it was our lowest count. This may have been due to the weather as the counts on cold weather seem to be down on those done in December.

I would like to wrap up by thanking everyone for their efforts this past year. We've had some very good turn outs and it's great to see people getting along for even half a day, if that's all they can spare. It all helps and it all makes our day out a lot easier. I'd also like to thank those who took up office bearer roles, Ken as Vice President, Beryl as Secretary, John as Treasurer, Darren for putting together the newsletter and of course Peter for Publicity. That is not to take away anything from anyone else, you've all chipped in and worked efficiently and harmoniously. Let's hope we can do it again this year.

No communication has been received from Grand Strzelecki Track Committee regarding their request for help to maintain the track, Friends of MNP communicated our resolution that we were only prepared to maintain the track to our boundary.

Group monthly activities have to be submitted onto the database and Parks just tick the box for approval – more work for us!!!
